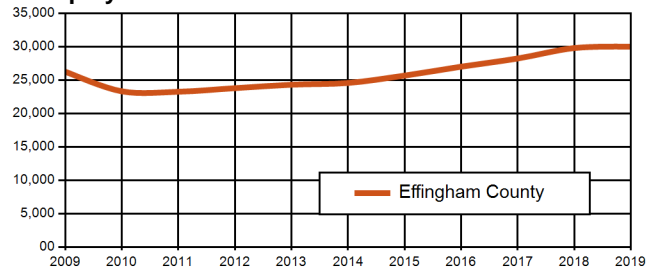

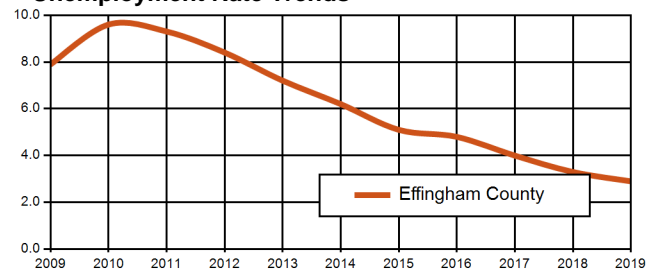

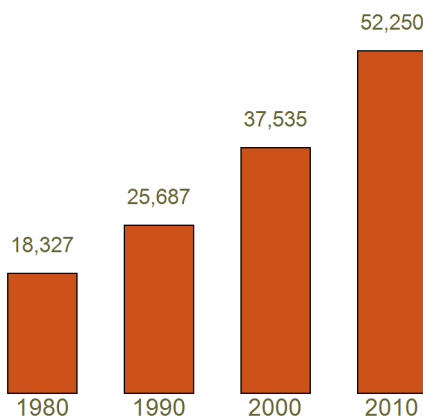

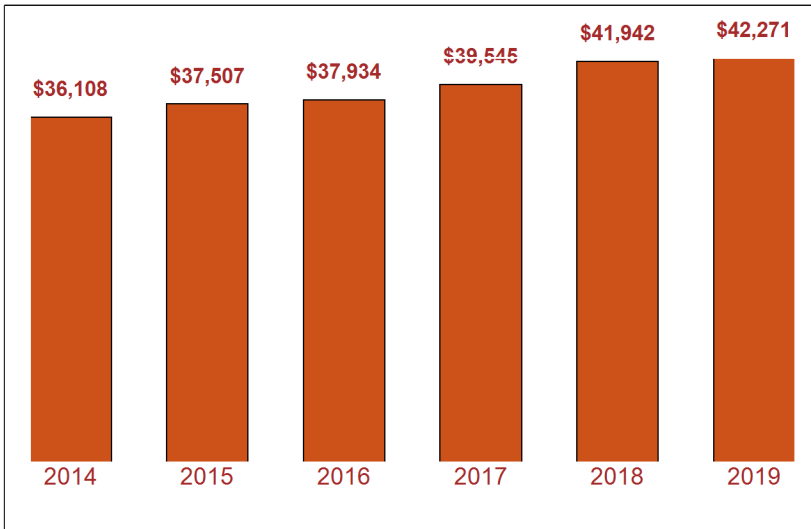

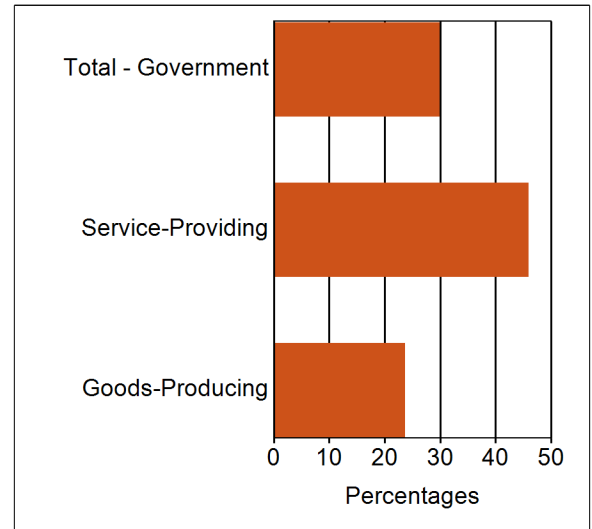
Effingham Per Capita Income
