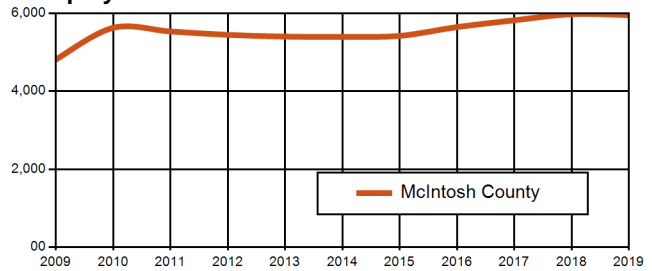

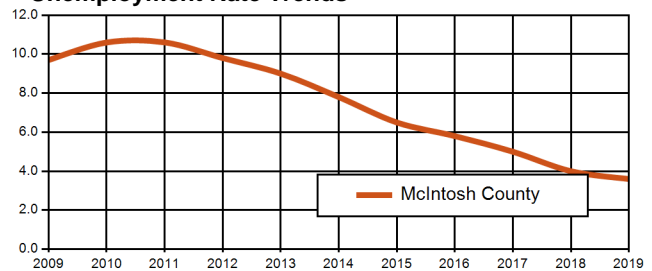

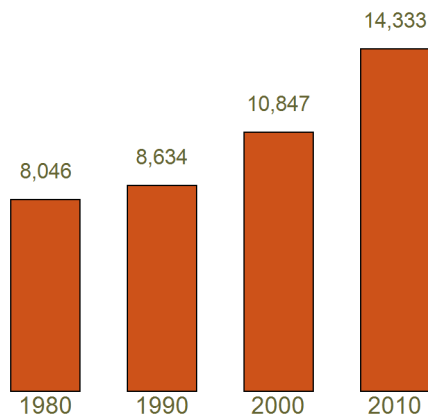
Employment Trends

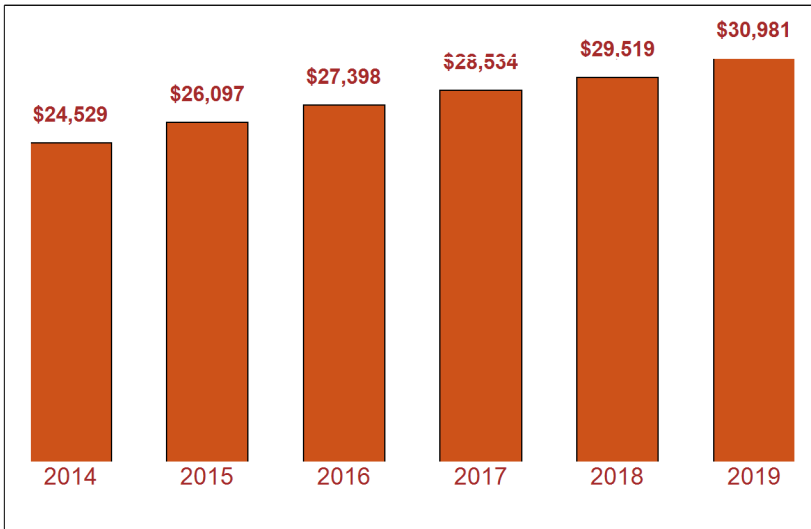

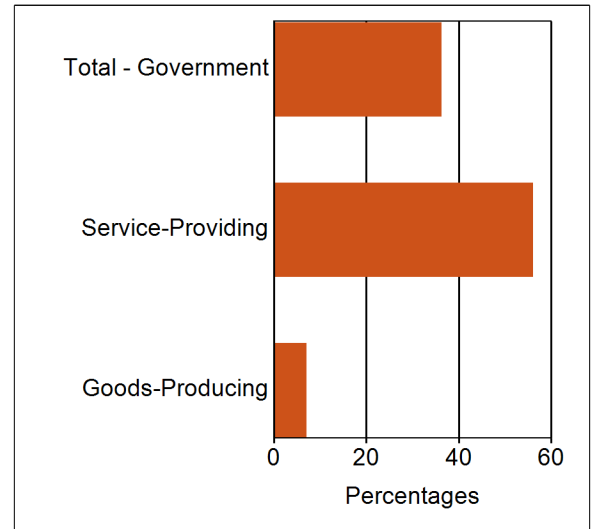
McIntosh Per Capita Income
