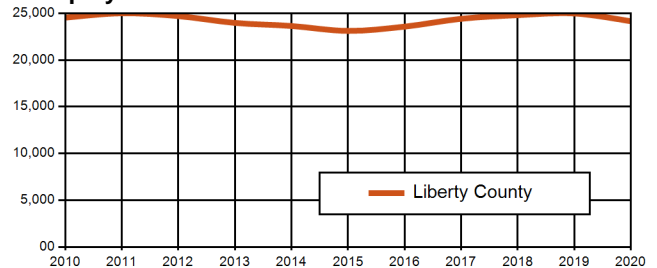

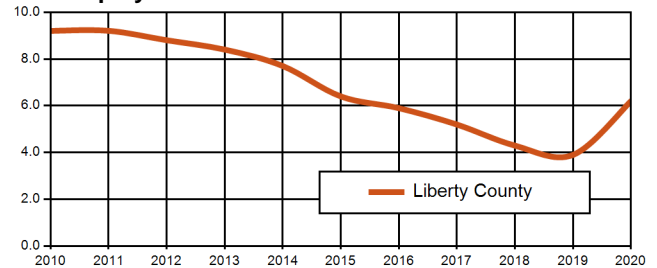

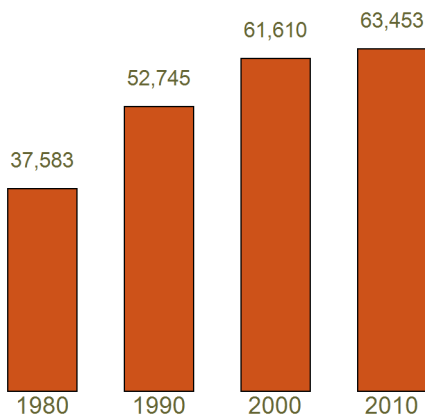

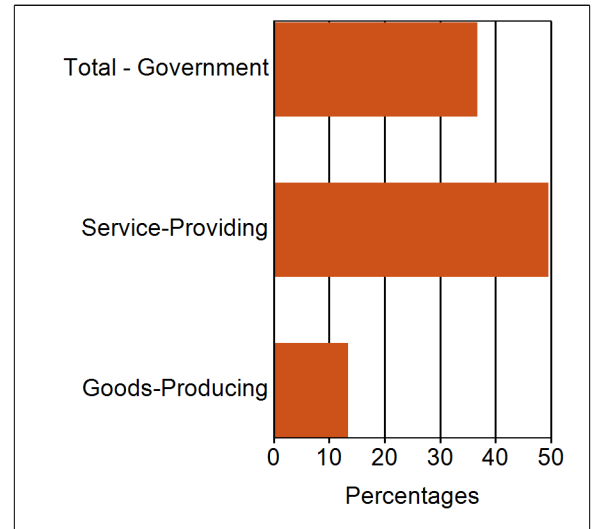
## Liberty Per Capita Income
