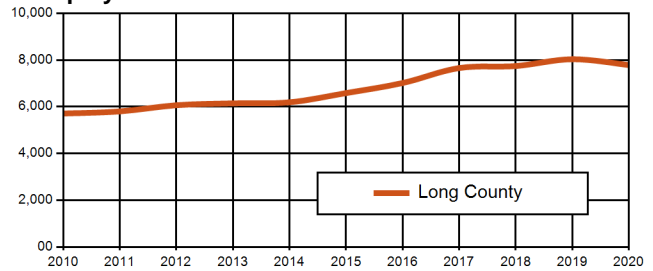

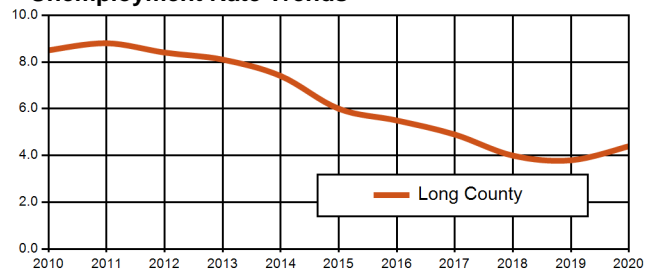

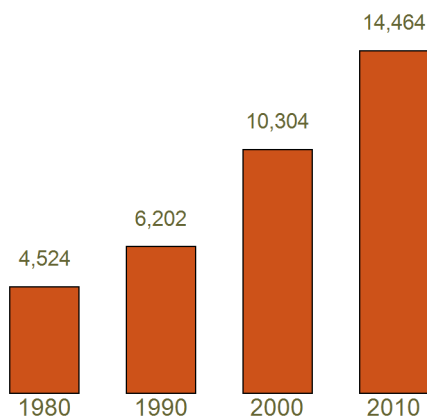

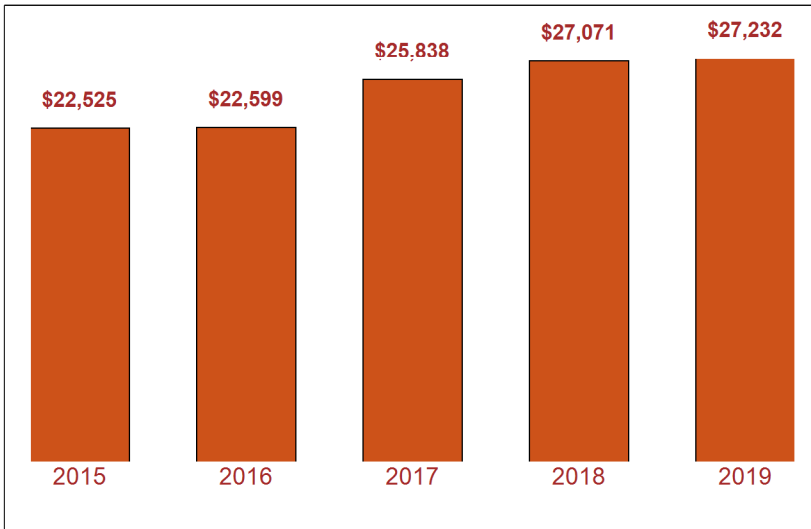

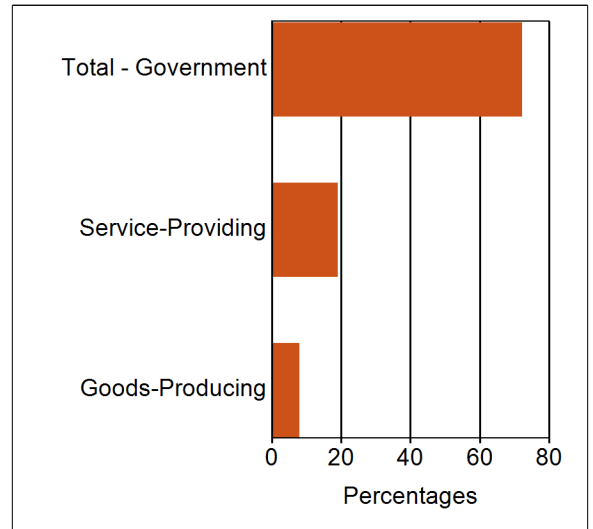
Long Per Capita Income
