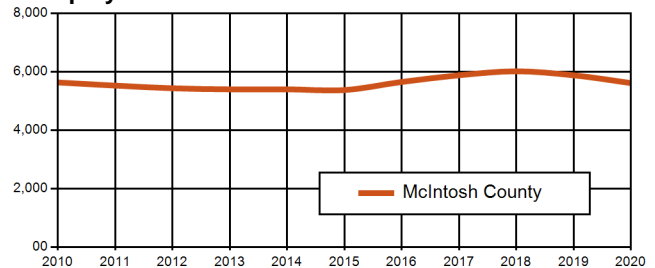

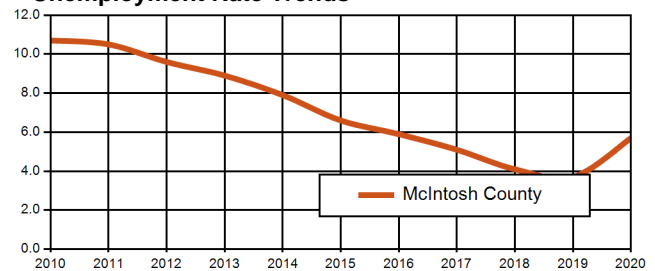

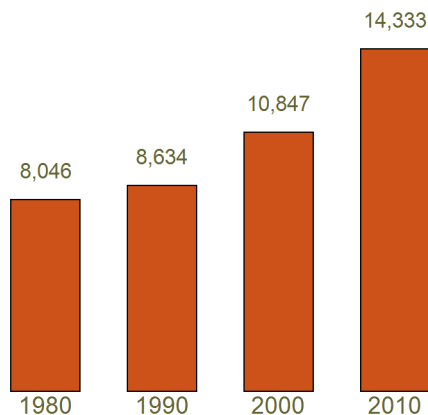

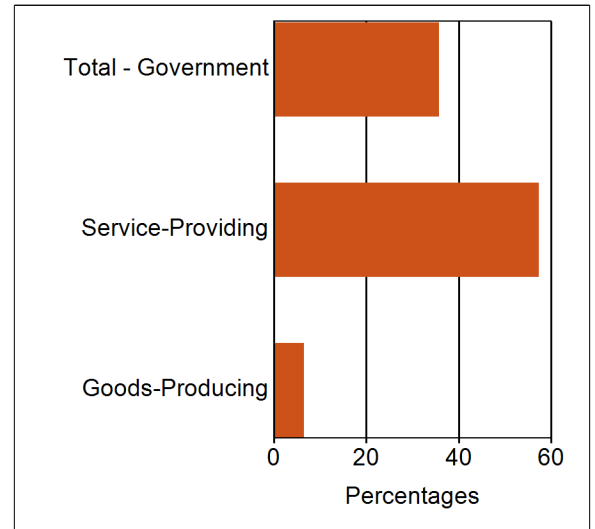
## McIntosh Per Capita Income
