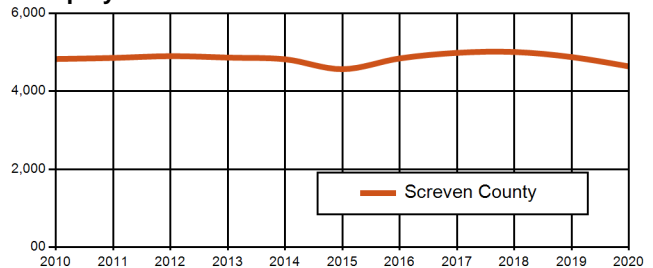

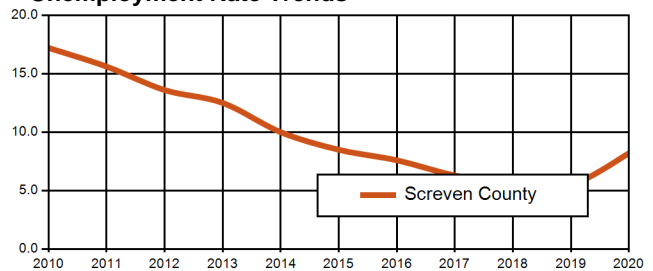

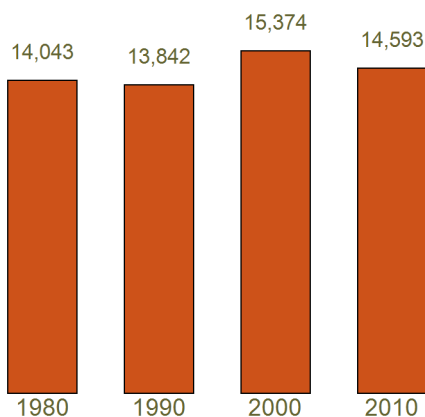
Employment Trends

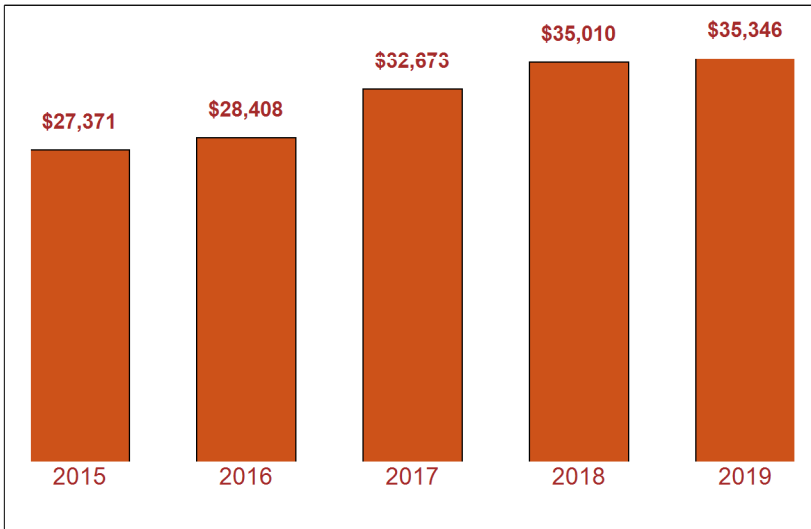

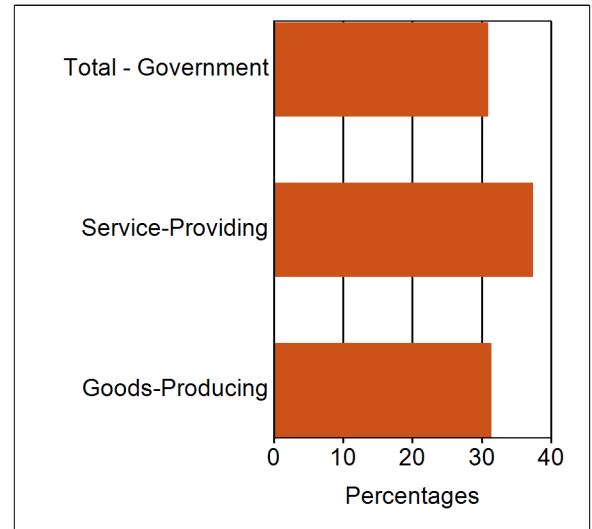
Screven Per Capita Income
