# Chairman's Report

Chairman Lynn Tootle welcomed and thanked everyone for taking the time to attend the Coastal Workforce Development Board Meeting. He then announced the following:

Mr. Tootle spoke about the recent Executive Order issued by the White House and its potential impact on the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA). The Executive Order aims to modernize American workforce programs to better prepare citizens for high-paying, skilled trade jobs of the future. Mr. Tootle emphasized that this directive could lead to significant changes in how WIOA is implemented, with a stronger focus on aligning training programs with industry demands and emerging technologies. This shift is intended to ensure that the American workforce remains competitive and well-equipped for the evolving job market and digital economy.

# 2025 Adult Education and Family Literacy Act (AEFLA) Grant Competition

The 2025 Adult Education and Family Literacy Act (AEFLA) Grant Competition administered by the Technical College System of Georgia (TCSG) is to support technical colleges dedicated to enhancing adult education services across the state. This initiative aims to equip individuals with essential skills such as obtaining a High School Equivalency or Diploma, learning English, supporting their children's education, and transitioning into postsecondary education and careers. The technical colleges in our region: Coastal Pines Technical College, Ogeechee Technical College and Savannah Technical College has submitted applications for one or more of the following grants:

- **General Adult Education Grants:** Funded under WIOA Sections 231 & 225, along with state matching funds, these grants enable providers to offer adult basic education, adult secondary education, English language acquisition programs, integrated education and training, and workplace preparation activities.
- Integrated English Literacy and Civics Education (IELCE)- Under WIOA Section 243, these grants support education activities that prepare English language learners to function

- effectively as parents, employees, and citizens. IELCE programs integrate English language instruction with civics education and workforce training.
- **Family Literacy Grants:** Funded under WIOA Section 231, these grants support programs that integrate adult education, parent education, children's education, and interactive literacy activities, fostering a holistic family learning environment.
- Corrections Education Grants: Under WIOA Section 225, these grants provide educational services to justice-involved individuals, aiming to reduce recidivism by addressing their academic and career needs.

# **Hiring Status Update**

• On Friday, March 28<sup>th</sup>, a meeting was held with the HR Partner to discuss upcoming staffing needs. Sub-Regional Business Services Interviews are scheduled for April 30<sup>th</sup>, May 1<sup>st</sup>, and May 6<sup>th</sup> with applications being accepted on an ongoing basis. Interviews for the Finance Administrator position are set for May 6<sup>th</sup>. Additionally, the posting for the Assistant Director position is currently in progress.

# Recommending Approval for the following Action Items:

- The No-Cost Extension for the PY24-25 Sole Source Agreement for Technical Assistance Services will be provided by John G. Chamberlin, Consultant. The remaining balance of the current contract, which covers the period from June 1, 2025, to June 30, 2026, is up to \$19,542.
- The Approval of the **PY25 Adult and Dislocated Worker Sub-Award** (July 1, 2025 June 30, 2026) includes funding of up to \$893,223 for **Eckerd Connects/Paxen** across all 10 counties, with level funding.
- The Approval is granted for the PY25 Youth Sub-Award, covering the period from July 1, 2025, through June 30, 2026, to Eckerd Connects/Paxen, doing business as Eckerd Youth Alternative, Inc., at up to level funding. The award includes the following sub-regional allocations:

  - \$274,067 for Chatham County; and
  - o \$269,298 for Camden, Glynn, and McIntosh (CGM) Counties.

  consistent level.


# **Financial Report**


July 1, 2023 – June 30, 2025 100% Must be Spent by June 30, 2025

# **PY24 Formula Grants Overview**


As of January 31, 2025 July 1, 2024 – June 30, 2026 80% Must be Spent and/or Obligated by June 30, 2025

Ms. Sheron Morgan reported on the following:

Eligible Training Provider Application: Savannah Technical College – Fast Track Airframe and Powerplant Certificate Program: This is a four-week industry recognized certification program that provides training to those that are prequalified to take the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) Mechanic's Exam for Airframe and Powerplant Ratings. This program bridges the skill gaps that individuals have from working in the aviation maintenance field to the knowledge needed to take the FAA Mechanic's Exam or for an individual with an interest in Aviation Mechanics to include young adults. The earnings after course work and FAA Mechanic's Certification allow skilled workers to earn higher wages averaging \$70,000 and for those transitioning from the military to the civilian workforce more seamless.
